### 2. Early years

Krusenstern was born in Estonia, into a Baltic German family descended from the Swedish aristocratic family von Krusenstjerna. After graduating from the Naval Cadet Corps in 1787, he joined the Russian Imperial Navy, and served in the war against Sweden.

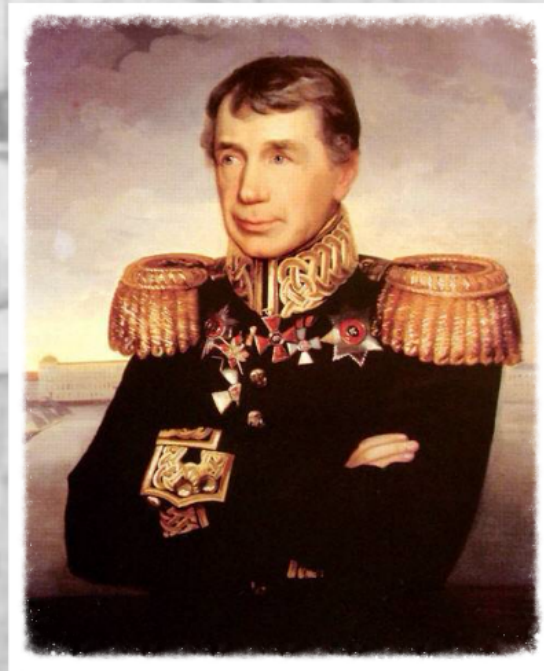


### 3. Later years

He served in the Royal Navy in 1793-99, visiting America, India and China. Krusenstern liked animals very much and his dog (Spaniel) was always with him in the expeditions. Under the patronage of Tsar Alexander I Krusenstern led the first Russian circumnavigation of the world. Krusenstern arrived back at Kronstadt in August 1806. In 1816, he was elected a foreign member of the Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences. In 1827 he became the director of the Russian Naval Cadet Corps. Krusenstern became an admiral in 1841.






### 3. Later years
