I agree, I have no choice.

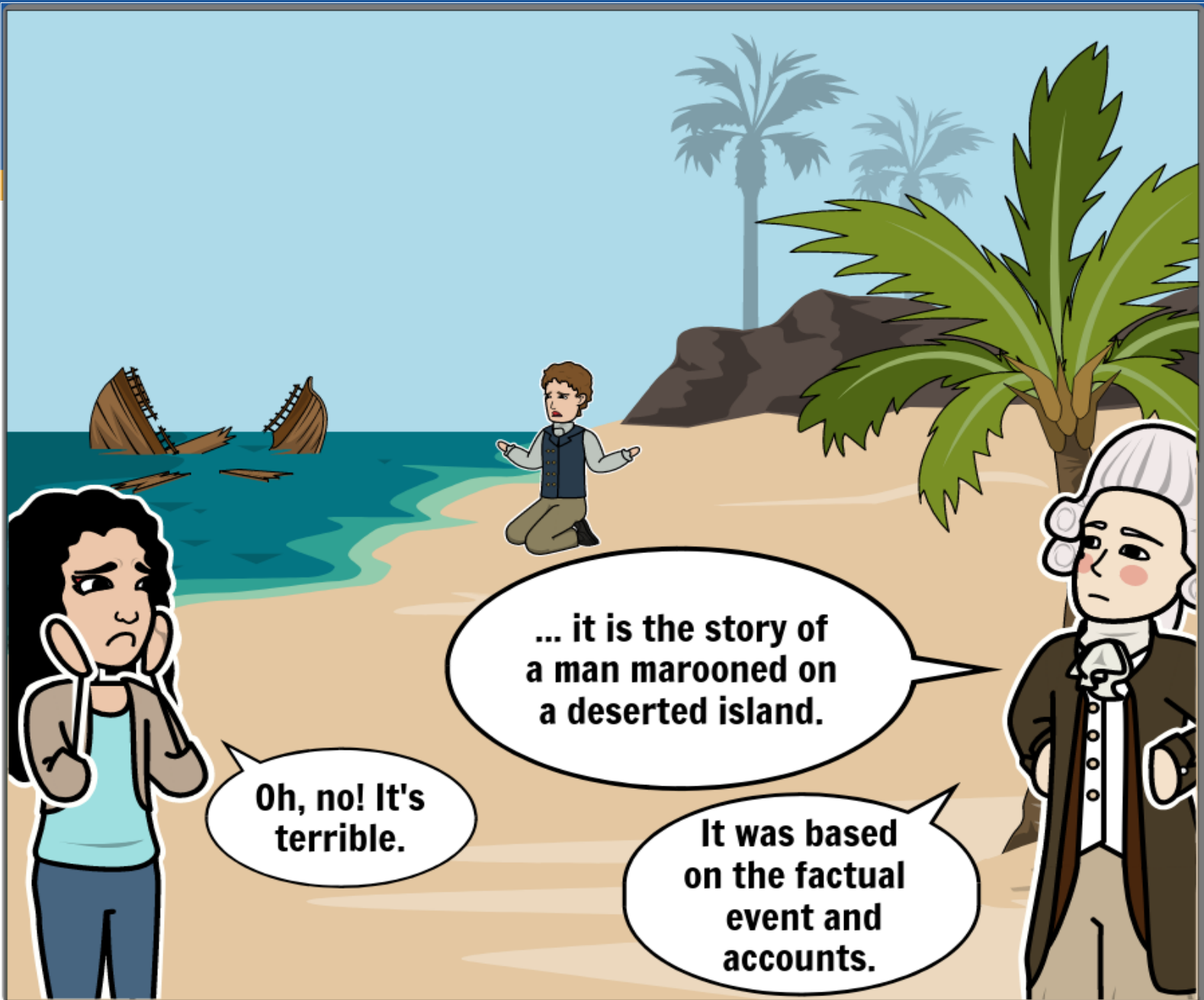
